Search for a topic, then click on 'images'. To refine the search for high resolution etc, click 'tools'. Select the 'usage rights' drop down menu if you want to filter for free images.

Saving and editing images

This is a complicated topic. If you are unsure, always save images in the highest resolution possible, in TIFF format (or as a PDF). However, many social media platforms will only allow you to share JPGs or PNGs.
